- If there are **not** more candidates than vacancies any duly nominated candidate will be declared elected at the nomination meeting

To vote in this election you must have registered by midday on Tuesday 7th June 2022.

Le Connétable thanked Francois Le Luyer, on behalf of the Parish and his fellow Officers, for the three year term he has just completed. The amount of time he has given is very much appreciated, particularly with regards to animal welfare in and around the Parish.

Le Connétable then asked for nominations to fill the role of Centenier.

Philip John Rondel stood to nominate Francois Le Luyer for a second term of office. Mr Rondel had served with Mr Le Luyer as an honorary officer saying that he is a very good officer of excellent standing. He then read out the nomination paper signed by himself and nine seconders, all electors in the Parish.

John Maxwell Renouf then stood to second the nomination.

To allow for the meeting to be open for the statutory ten minutes the Connétable gave the Assembly details of upcoming events in the Parish with regards to the Liberation 77 celebrations and The Queens Platinum Jubilee.

At the end of the ten minute duration, and there being no further nominations for the role of Centenier, Le Connétable announced Francois Le Luyer duly elected to the role for a further term of three years. He warned him to attend the Royal Court on Friday 10th June at 10am to take his Oath of Office.

There being no further business Le Connetable thanked everyone for attending and declared the meeting closed at 7.45pm.
